


SOLAR CARS CAN GO SO FAR!

We have re-stocked our library with new books for our avid readers. Thank you Ms Joanna Tan and Librarians for this initiative!










LEARNING MALAY THE FUN WAY!

During their Malay lesson with Cikgu Rayza, our Year 8s expanded their vocabulary with some new words!

They were tasked to approach our staff to find out the meaning of the new words ("mempelawa" – invite; "mempelajari" – learning; "mempercayai" – trusting). They then presented their findings at class.





HOW TEENAGERS CAN SPEND LESS TIME ON THEIR PHONES

"Screen time" refers to the time spent on a device with a screen, e.g. a smartphone, computer, television, or gaming console. Screen time is being thoroughly studied for its impact on mental health, as it is correlated with mental and physical harm in child development.

ELECTROSTATICS AT WORK

Our Year 8s learned about electrostatics, a branch of physics that studies electric charges at rest!

An electrostatic charge is produced by friction between two surfaces, such as the movement of paper through a copier or printer.


In the following photos, we see that a stick, charged by friction with a piece of cloth, attracts the aluminium can until it rolls off the table.



















MIX AND MATCH VOCABULARY TO WRITE AN ESSAY

Our Year 8s learned how to write an essay in Malay using a "vocabulary mix and match" activity.

The essay, entitled "Penggunaan Media Sosial dalam Kalangan Remaja" (Usage of Social Media Amongst Teenagers), was broken up into segments. Students were tasked with joining the segments together by studying their context and the conjunctions used.





PRACTISING OUR VIDEO PRESENTATION SKILLS

Under the tutelage of our English Teacher Mr Justin Thoo, our Year 7s got a chance to practise their presentation and video-editing skills!

Mylo and Jasmine presented on upcycling, the practice of transforming unused or discarded items into useful items of greater value. They also talked about why and how we should upcycle.

Emmelyn then spoke on the hanfu, a traditional Chinese attire that predates the cheongsam and samfu. She touched on the hidden meaning of the floral embroidery, as well as the styles that impacted the hanfu's appearance before ending with a special mention of the "flower petal" makeup.

Hephzibah presented on Isiagu, a fabric that comes in diverse colours of choice. Isiagu is traditionally worn at special events by Igbo, a tribe in eastern Nigeria, and is made of cotton or velvet with lion head print.































DEBATING THE HOT TOPIC OF CLIMATE CHANGE

Our Year 8s had an exciting time of debating on a hot topical issue!

Under the guidance of Teacher Mr Siva, they formed cogent "for" and "against" points to the issue of whether economic growth should be achieved at the expense of global climate stability.

This activity helped our students develop not just their critical thinking skills, but also their ability to present their viewpoints persuasively.





GETTING SOME COLOUR ON CHROMATOGRAPHY

Our Year 8 students conducted an experiment to learn about chromatography!

Chromatography is a technique that is used to separate components in a mixture. It can also be used to partially identify the components in said mixture.

A solvent is first used to dissolve some solutes and carry them up the filter paper. The solutes will separate as they move up the paper at different speeds.





YOUNG DESIGNERS IN THE HOUSE!

Our young builders were tasked to build and design their own fans and race cars. They did a wonderful job, demonstrating a keen eye for detail.

MAKING ABSTRACT ART

Our Art Teacher Mr Ginn introduced our Years 4 to 6 students to abstract art in February and April! Students were tasked to create their own abstract art pieces inspired by pioneer abstract artist Hilma Af Klint's work.

Our Year 6s were given the option of learning the secrets of photorealistic pencil drawing. Students who took up the challenge could choose their subject matter. Elephants, cats and puppies were painstakingly rendered to life with pencils on paper, each piece taking about 15 hours on average to complete. Stay tuned as the completed artworks will definitely make your jaw drop!

Our students have now moved on to their third major art project of the year their self-portraits, which aim to immortalise the best versions of themselves on paper.
