The rock cycle is a web of processes that outline how each of the three major rock types — igneous, metamorphic, and sedimentary — form and break down based on the different applications of heat and pressure over time.











To wrap up the week, **Eco Botany students unleashed their creativity** by painting their terracotta pots. After the holidays, they will be potting succulents that are adapted to arid conditions, into these pots. Terracotta pots are amazingly ideal for plants that do not like wet feet such as cacti. 






